

Sports Premium

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

This year we have been allocated £9750. At Dog Kennel Hill, all after school sports clubs are currently free of charge. We have chosen to spend our funding in the following ways:

After School Provision to extend and enhance the range of curriculum sport

- Multisports – 1 hour per week for Years 1 & 2
- Football – 1 hour per week for Years 3 & 4
- Football – 1 hour per week for Years 5 & 6
- Fitness Club – 1 hour per week for Years 5 & 6

COST - £4779

- Netball - 1 hour per week for Years 5 & 6

COST - £1350



Competitions and Teacher Bacons Sports Partnership - £1250

- This new subscription service allows the school access to a full calendar of competitive events for both KS1 and KS2. This includes elite competitions, whole key stage festivals and specialised events for pupils with SEND.
- The service also comprises of training for NQTs in teaching PE and training for KS1 in enhancing physical well-being of pupils through a programme called 'create development' – this is 3 training

sessions for the PE coordinator and 1 other KS1 teacher focusing on assessment, new curriculum and KS1 resources.

Training for Teachers

The PE co-ordinator will be working alongside class teachers for 1 day per week to help develop their expertise in teaching across all areas of the PE curriculum and providing resources.

COST - £4779

TOTAL EXPENDITURE - £12,158

The difference of £2408 is made up from the school budget.
