Literacy

- Write a setting description using complex sentences and noun phrases.
- Write using figurative language (metaphor, simile, alliterations, personification and onomatopoeia).
- Write persuasive letters from different perspectives.
- Explore the features of and write a non-chronological reports about St. Lucia.
- Write recounts and reports about experiments conducted in our Science work.

PSHE

- Learn to recognise and respond appropriately to a wider range of feelings in others
- Understand that that marriage is a commitment freely entered into by both people, that no one should marry if they don't absolutely want to do so or are not making this decision freely for themselves
