The London Eye

Today we are going to focus on one landmark and learn more about it.



The London Eye is the most popular tourist attraction that you have to pay to visit in the United Kingdom. It is on the banks of the River Thames. It has spokes that come out from the centre point, just like an enormous bicycle wheel!

It's wheely expensive!

The cost of going on the London Eye is £15.50 for adults or £7.75 for children.

The London Eye was opened in celebration of the **millennium** on December 31st 1999. On New Years Eve each year, they light fireworks from the pods on the wheel.



Get on quick!

The wheel moves so slowly that it doesn't stop to let people on – you have to get on and off while it is still moving!



There are 32 pods on the wheel and each one holds 25 people.

Did you know?

It takes 30 minutes to go all the way round the wheel.
