

# DKH Weekly Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you are all well and staying safe during this very challenging time. We are indeed all missing you here at school. It has been strange over the last few weeks not talking to all the children, staff and parents every day. However, we have all been busy planning home learning and liaising with staff and families for onsite provision while making sure our community support continues and everyone stays safe. It is not the start to the Summer Term we all imagined but it is the start that we are now all trying to make the most of.

## Home learning

Home learning commenced again on the 20th of April and we will continue to provide weekly updates. Please make sure that you are doing as much of the home learning as you can. The teachers have worked hard to prepare a range of activities but if you feel you need more please do email them. Over the weeks we will continue to look at ways to improve home learning and ensure that all families are able to access the provision, we want to make it as useful as possible whilst not putting too much pressure on parents and families. We want to continue to provide that balance of being supportive and providing an education for the children.

## Onsite provision

The message from the government is to **stay at home, protect the NHS and save lives**. I understand that your child is not getting the education that they deserve or need right now and I hope that we get back to school as quickly as possible but until the government says that it is safe to do so, my message will continue to be that the school will only be open for emergency support.

The categories themselves have not changed and advice from the DFE is you should only send your child into school as an absolute last resort. The categories of children who are attending school are:

- 1) Critical worker families
- 2) Children with a social worker attached to the family
- 3) EHCP children whose basic needs can not be met at home

I am lucky to have staff who are willing to support the national effort and are travelling to school each day to support those families who fit into these categories.

## Community Support

Our community spirit has been heart warming during this time, so many parents have offered to help each other in a range of ways. We have parents who are supporting each other via Whatsapp groups and many parents have donated food items which have been made into parcels for those families in need. If you feel that you need support with food, someone to talk to, help with home learning or are able to offer support to other families, please do contact the school office.

## School Dinners

We have arranged for those families who qualify for Free School Meals through their benefits, to receive weekly supermarket vouchers from Edenred, this will continue until we are advised differently. From the week of the 4<sup>th</sup> of May, we will also be offering all children a daily packed lunch which they are able to collect at school each day between 12:30 and 1:00. This is a Southwark Healthy Lunch and will consist of a sandwich, snack, fruit and water. If you would like your child to have a packed lunch, please complete the survey link which was sent via text message to you today. We need an idea of how many children require a packed lunch before Tuesday each week, so we can order the food for the following week please. Please note that if you order a packed lunch it will need to be for the whole week, if you are unable to collect lunch on a specific day, please notify the office before 9:30 so we can notify the catering company.

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

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## The future

Our induction programme will look a little different this year, but we hope that it will still do a good job of ensuring that the children are able to settle into school easily.

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## Vouchers for Free School Meals

I would like to apologise to families waiting for the vouchers. Unfortunately, the system that schools order the vouchers through is not able to cope with the demand and so there have been significant delays.

For families who we already have on record as being eligible for Free School Meals, you should receive an email with an eCode. This can be converted into an eGift card for a supermarket of your choice at [www.freeschoolmeals.co.uk](http://www.freeschoolmeals.co.uk). If you do not receive an email with a code, or if there are any problems please let us know by phone or email.

We have had a large number of families apply for Free School Meals this week. Once we have your application, we will send this to Southwark and they will let us know who is eligible. If you have not yet applied but would like to, please contact the office. We will be in contact with families who have applied as soon as we hear back from Southwark.

Families in receipt of the following benefits can apply:

- o Income Support
- o Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- o Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- o Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- o The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- o Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- o Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- o Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If you are passing the school, during your daily exercise, you can see it proudly on display on the fence outside. The children also made birthday cards for Captain Tom, have been following Joe Wicks every morning and are now experts at Just Dance!


Jamal, you played *Get Cooking* and weighed your ingredients to make these amazing treats.

I am sure you enjoyed eating them too!




Charles, you played *How Much Pasta* and we can see enjoyed guessing which object weighed the most.
