Early years have produced some fantastic work this week and have very much enjoyed the activities on 'Maths with Parents' – take a look, I'm sure you will be impressed!



It was easy making the frogs jump in the pool. Now there are zero frogs on the log!



Aarush, in Palm Class planned and designed a very impressive robot as part of his homework.


We can see how much thought you put into this Aarush!
