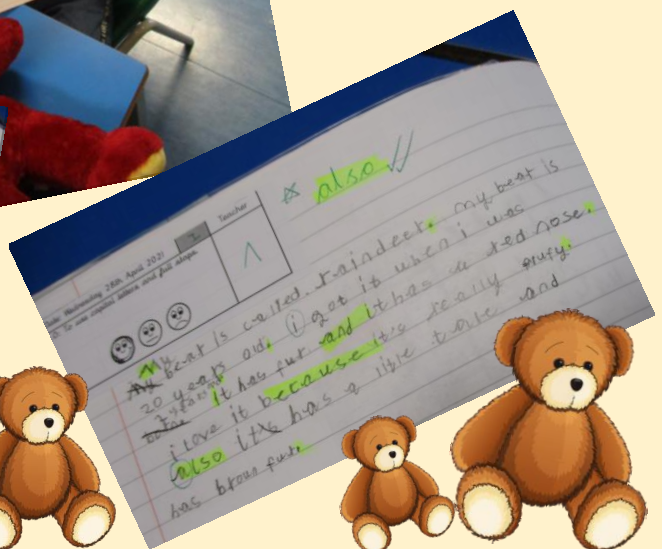
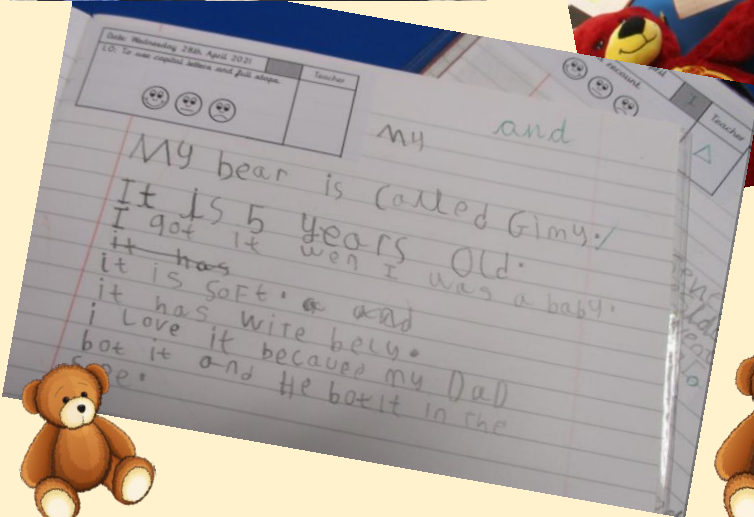
Year 1 have been really busy learning about old and new toys.
