

## Knowledge Organisers

These one page, fully editable knowledge organisers have been put together to support teachers when introducing a topic to their pupils. All of the knowledge organisers work alongside Oddizzi's schemes of work, pathway document and the year group vocabulary and glossary banks.

### Suggested Use

### Glossary

**map symbol:** *a small picture on a map that shows you where different things are (such as a bus station or a school)*

**route:** *how you get from one place to another (for example, “you walk up the hill and turn towards the school when you get to the top”)*

**settlement:** *a place where people live*
