What will I know by the end of the unit?

Vocabulary

Mosque	A Muslim building, often used for people to come together to pray and read the Qur'an. It might also be a Madrasah, a place where Muslim children attend to learn to read ancient Arabic and receipt the Qur'an.
Church	A Christian building where a community comes together to worship God through song, bible readings and prayer.
Gurdwara	Literally the house of the Guru (teacher), or doorway to the Guru. Gurdwara have a hall where the Sikh holy book can be read, and prayer said. There is also another hall called the langar where food is served each day to anyone visiting the Gurdwara.
Hindu Temple	Hindu religious building of worship. Some will have murti's (statues of gods and goddesses) to which offerings are brought daily. Often temples will also run meditation or yoga sessions to help people become healthier in mind, emotions and spiritually.
Synagogue	A building for Jewish people to come together and worship.
Buddhist Vihara or mediation centre	A building where Buddist all run meditation workshops, and have a shrine room where prayers, meditation and offerings can be given.
