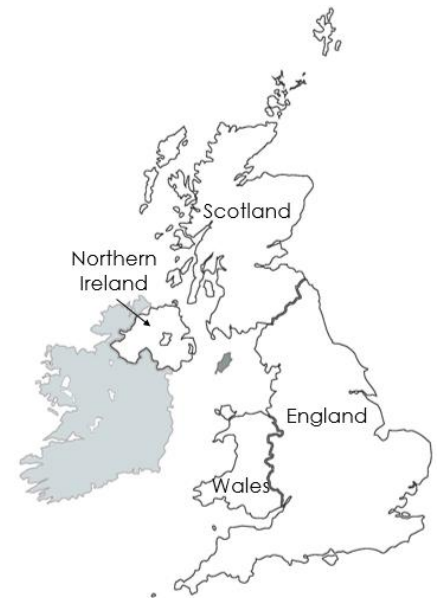
Key facts
