What will I know by the end of the unit?

Why do we need leaders?	<p>I can explain the value of leadership.</p> <p>I can explore the ideas behind why we need leaders, considering a range of ideas.</p> <p>I can critically evaluate different reasons for leaders and give my own reasoned view on the need for leadership in the world.</p>
What qualities do leaders possess?	<p>I can write a job description for a religious leader to present to a place of worship.</p> <p>I can write a job description for a religious leader and compare it with another religion.</p> <p>I can give a coherent job description for a religious leader which could be used by any religion.</p>
Who is an important religious leader in Southwark?	<p>I can say what makes a good religious leader in Southwark, and link their actions to sacred texts.</p> <p>I can suggest reasons for the similar and different job of a leader in Southwark.</p> <p>I can give a comprehensive account of what makes a successful leader in Southwark.</p>
Who are important world religious leaders?	<p>I can make links between an issue in the world that a religious leader has highlighted and affected.</p> <p>I can suggest reasons for and against religious leaders highlighting issues in the world.</p> <p>I can critically evaluate the role of more than one religious leader in the world and give my own reasoned views on it.</p>
Can I compare different religious leaders?	<p>I can make links between different religious leader on their duties and qualities.</p> <p>I can suggest reasons for shared qualities</p> <p>I can critically evaluate the role of more than one religious leader in the world and give my own reasoned views on it.</p>
What is the difference between a religious leader and a secular leader?	<p>I can make some references to the roles and duties of religious leaders in several religions.</p>

Vocabulary

Passion Plays	A dramatic presentation of the crucifixion of Jesus- a traditional part of Lent celebrations
Shrove Tuesday	Also known as 'Pancake Day', this day marks the beginning of Lent
Mardi Gras	The American celebration of Shrove Tuesday, a carnival-like celebration
Orthodox Church	A Christian church popular in Eastern Europe, Russia and Greece. Sometimes related to the Catholic Church.
Ramayana	A epic poem in Sanskrit, relating to Hindu beliefs
Passion Plays	A dramatic presentation of the crucifixion of Jesus- a traditional part of Lent celebrations
