Year 3: What can we learn about special symbols and signs used in special religions?

Big Question: How are symbols and saying important in religion?

Vocabulary

Tasbih: prayer beads

Topi: a crocheted Muslim cap worn by men when they come to times of prayer at home or at the mosque

Psalms: A book in the Bible (old Testament) filled with poems/songs that were written in praise and worship of God

Communion: When Christians re-enact the last meal, Jesus had with his disciples. Sharing bread and wine as symbols of his sacrifice upon the cross. The bread standing for his body broken, and the wine as a symbol of his blood. Christians believe this death on the cross was an eternal sacrifice that allows their wrong doing to be taken away.

Mass: In a Roman Catholic Church this is the name of the service where communion is re-enacted.

Allah: The Islamic language word for the one God

Qur'an: The Muslim holy book, containing Muslim people believe the words of God to human beings

Bible: The Christian holy boom, containing for Christian people words inspired by God
