Year 4: Why is the Bible special for Christians?

YEAR GROUP BIG QUESTION: What is special to me and the people in my community?

Vocabulary

Bible: A collection of 66 books that Christians believe contain the blueprint for how to live well in the world today

Parable: A made up story Jesus told which has a special meaning

Proverb: a saying which is seen as wise

Commandment: a law from God

Baptism: literally means to dower in water

Communion/Eucharist: special meal remembering Jesus last meal with his followers where Christians remember Jesus death on the cross and what it means to them

The Lord's Prayer: Famous prayer Jesus taught his followers

Sacred: holy or special

Lectern: Reading platform in a church

- Apply ideas like guidance or inspiration to my own chosen 'favourite words'
- Make links between the sayings of different religious groups and show how they are similar and different
