Attendance Matters!



We **all** have a legal responsibility to ensure every child is in school every day and on time. At DKH we maintain a minimum attendance rate of 96% and promote the importance of regular attendance.

Parents and carers can help us by:

- ringing on the first morning of all absences with the reason for the absence, and letting us know when your child will return
- arranging dental and doctor's appointments out of school hours or during school holidays
- and by keeping us updated by telephone or email if your child has an extended period of absence due to illness.

Our Curriculum

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) will be taught this half term. It is compulsory for all primary school children to receive relationship education. At DKH we follow the Christopher Winter's Project which builds on learning from previous years and revisits topics each year to cover them in greater depth. It includes lesson material on topics such as keeping clean, families, gender differences, personal space, puberty, relationships and many other topics. Year 2 have been learning about measures, capacity and volume in their maths lessons.


















Children estimated capacity and then tested their predictions. As you can see, they have become very confident using millilitres to measure accurately! You can learn more about capacity and volume at home, here!
