Note from the Office

The Local Authority provide free school meals to all children in Southwark but some families qualify for **additional pupil premium funding**, which we then use to enhance children's learning. If you have a household income of less that £16,100 per year or are entitled to universal credit please complete a Free School Meal (FSM) application and return the completed form to the school office.

Please note that if you qualify for FSM you may receive additional food vouchers from Southwark during the holiday period. Please note that the school are not involved in deciding who qualifies for FSM. This decision is made by the local authority


