Note from the Office

The Local Authority provide free school meals to all children in Southwark but some families qualify for **additional pupil premium funding**, which we then use to



enhance children's learning. If you have a household income of less that £16,100 per year or are entitled to universal credit please complete a Free School Meal (FSM) application and return the completed form to the school office.

Please note that if you qualify for FSM you may receive additional food vouchers from Southwark during the holiday period. Please note that the school are not involved in deciding who qualifies for FSM. This decision is made by the local authority

School Food Matters!

At Dog Kennel Hill, we care about students' health and their future. As you may recall from the email sent at the end of the summer term, we are introducing a new project, **Healthy Zones**, delivered by School Food Matters. This project aims to work on embedding and improving our school food policy and the food provision at afterschool club. School Food Matters are a charity that exists to teach children about food and to improve children's access to healthy and sustainable food during their time at school.

School Food Matters and DKH believe this work is crucial as all children, no matter where they live, should have the opportunity to be healthy especially as families are up against a flood of unhealthy food advertisements.

We want to make sure that the healthy changes we're making to our school food policy and clubs are ones that will work for you and your children. The project will actively involve students from the beginning with anonymous surveys, evaluation stations and menu development sessions in afterschool club as well as student workshops. It's also important to us that we have engagement from you as a parent or carer.
