Don't forget to come to school dressed as your TTRS avatar, Learning with Parents Mathscot or favourite number on Friday 18th November!






How Are You Feeling?


We love LEARNING

In Maths, this term, Year 5 have been learning about a range of efficient multiplication and division strategies.


