This year Dog Kennel Hill will be taking part in Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a way to bring joy to a young boy or girl who may not receive a Christmas present this year.

Families who would like to take part are asked to wrap a shoebox in festive paper, place a sticker on the box indicating if the box is for a boy or girl and the age range. Then the fun part: to fill the box with small gifts which will bring joy to a child. Pupils at DKH will be provided with a **How to Pack a Shoebox leaflet** which will fully explains the project and include the sticker for the front of the shoebox.

If you would like to take part, wrapped and filled shoeboxes need to be returned to DKH by the 11th of November. They will then go to a collection point for worldwide distribution. Operation Christmas Child has pledged to send two-thirds of the donations it receives from the UK to Ukraine or neighbouring countries like Maldova or Romania who that are hosting many Ukrainian refugee families.

DKH has set themselves a target of collecting 20 boxes full of gifts, but if we can get even more, then that would be amazing! If you would like to



We love LEARNING

In Year 6 we have been working on fractions. We have been using manipulatives (linking cubes and fraction tiles) to represent and find equivalent fractions. We've also been simplifying fractions and our knowledge of our times tables has been really useful for this. We have focused on using accurate vocabulary to explain our reasoning and some of the words we've used are: equivalent, numerator, denominator and common factors. Take a look at some of our maths in action!



We have also been learning how to write a biography and have been writing a biography on Harriet Tubman, as part of our focus for Black History Month.

Year 6 has been working very hard to retell the story of Sleeping Beauty, which is an introduction to our new text, The Wedding Ghost.
