
Our Curriculum

The Relationship, Sex and Health Education (RSE) curriculum became statutory September 2020. Relationships and Sex Education supports and guides children and young people in lifelong learning about relationships, emotions, the human biology of sex and sexuality. It is **compulsory** for all primary children to receive relationship education. At DKH we follow the Christopher Winter's Project.


We love LEARNING

After that, they planned a new story called *Too Much Talk at DKH*. It was based on the original story, but they changed the characters and the objects. They mapped out their story and then started to write...
































To celebrate the coronation of King Charles III on 6th May 2023, DKH will be holding a special day of exciting celebrations and fun activities for all pupils on
