




We love LEARNING

Eucalyptus's first science topic of the year was learning about how the body functioned. Since then, we have really focused on making a healthy choice when having snacks and making sure to exercise regularly. At the start of the Summer term, in our PSHE lessons, we were looking at Healthy Lifestyles and Healthy Relationship Dynamics. These lessons, combined with an improvement in the weather, gave us a renewed focus on our Daily Mile sessions. We worked out the perimeter of the playground by measuring the length and the width (which we totalled and then doubled).
