


We love LEARNING

We have read three different texts: Lost and Found, Not Now, Bernard! and The Journey Home.


We wrote diary entries in role as Bernard and described his character:

We used our ideas about monsters and strange creatures from the stories to create a moving monster in DT. We used split pins as the pivots and then we linked levers together to make linkages.








