





We love LEARNING


In **Elm Class** we have been working very hard. This week, we covered so many exciting topics and we are proud to share some of our learning highlights below.


In **Computing**, we have been learning about website design. Here are some examples of our website drafts on paper. We are looking forward to creating these on iPads and computers.






In **English**, we used drama to re-enact a forest scene from *The Wedding Ghost*. In our writing, we used many writing devices, including personification. Take a look at some examples:
