This week our theme has been ambition. It has been wonderful to see so many children around the school thinking about how to fulfil their ambitions.



# We love LEARNING

Elm class have been very busy this week. In Maths we have been constructing and interpreting line graphs as well pie charts. We used an easy way to construct and understand pie charts, by using different coloured multi-links.

In Science our electricity unit is very exciting. In pairs, we created deliberate faulty circuit diagrams and circuits that our partner then had to correct. We also investigated what would happen when we change the voltage (number of cells) as well as the number of components. We are certainly learning quite a lot!

Across English and history we are continuing with our topic on WW2. Look at our fantastic display, which show cases just some of the amazing work we've been doing.
