




### **Our Curriculum**

The Relationship, Sex and Health Education (RSE) curriculum became statutory in September 2020. Relationships and SexEducation supports and guides children andyoung people in lifelong learning about relationships, emotions, the human biologyof sex and sexuality. It is compulsory for allprimary school children to receive relationship education. At DKH we follow the Christopher Winter's Project. 
### **Basketball**
