
Academies







Uniform grant

School travel

Child employment

All children under the age of 16 will require a permit to work. The youngest age a child can work part-time is 13, except children involved in areas like television, film, theatre, sporting events or modelling who will need a license if they are missing school. If the child is a Southwark resident, the person in charge of running the event must apply to Southwark Council for a child performance license.

If the child will not be with their parent, school teacher or home tutor during their employment, they must be supervised by a chaperone who has been approved by the council.

Businesses intending to employ school aged children must apply for a child employment permit before they can be employed. If a child is working without a child employment permit, there's a risk that the employer won't be insured against accidents involving the child.

For advice and applications for child performance licenses, chaperone licenses and child employment permits, please email Southwark Council's child employment officer at ptl@southwark.gov.uk.

Private fostering

If you are looking after a child or young person who is not a close relative (close relatives are birth parents, step parents by legal marriage, siblings, grandparents, aunts or uncles whether they are full blood, half blood or by marriage) for 28 days or more, you must notify Southwark Council on 020 7525 1921. We will make sure that you and the child are given support and we will also advise you about the other services which might be helpful.

Confirmation of school offer

Applicants who apply on time will receive their child's offer of a school place by email on Monday, 3rd March 2025 after 5pm. This email will also include information on what to do next.

Rejecting an offer

- Rejection: Monday, 17th March 2025 rejection of offers must be returned by this date or they will automatically be accepted.
- Should you wish to reject the offer of a school place allocated to your child, you must notify the school admissions team by email at schools.admissions@southwark.gov.uk and include your unique application reference.
- ▶ **Waiting list** that remain open until the 10th July 2025. If offered a place on a waiting list you have 5 days to accept the offer.
- ▶ Appeals: Check dates of appeal hearings with individual schools. For further information about the appeals process contact Southwark Council's school admissions team on 020 7525 5337 or by obtaining a copy of the School Admissions Appeals Code from the Department for Education (DfE), contact details on page 48 of the brochure.
- If you miss these dates, your chances of being offered a place at a preferred school will be reduced.

If the school is oversubscribed, first priority will be given to children with an education, health and care plan or statement of special educational needs naming the school followed by children who meet the following criteria, in priority order:

- 1. Looked after children (LAC) and children who were previously looked after (PLAC) but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order. Children as internationally adopted previously looked after children (IAPLAC)
- 2. Children with exceptional medical or social needs
- 3. Siblings of pupils attending the school at the time the application is received
- 4. Pupils who live nearest to the school on the basis of a straight line home to Academy distance

Ability, aptitude and banding tests

- If you are applying to a secondary school that uses banding within its criteria, your child will be required to take a test. Please contact the school directly for further details on banding test arrangements.
- If you are thinking of applying to a secondary school that tests a child for ability/aptitude for the purposes of admission, you must ensure that you register your child for the test before each school's published deadline and you must also submit your child's online admissions application by 31 October 2023. Please check each school's website or contact the school directly for further information about their test date and arrangements.

Medical/Social Reason

If you have ticked the 'social/medical' box, you must provide additional information to support your application such as a recent medical/social report or letter from a professional. (This will need to be uploaded.)

Step 1: Getting started

- Before you start your online application, you will need to do some research.
- Visit your local authority's website for details about how applications are processed.
- Find schools in your area by using the Map.
- Read the admissions criteria for the schools you are interested in.
- Visit schools.
- Check how places were offered in previous years.
- You should check transport policies for local authorities (outside London).

Step 2: What to do if this is the first time you are applying online using eAdmissions

If you have used the eAdmissions system in the last 3 years to apply for a school place for any of your children you do not need to register again. Instead please go to Step 3.

- If you used the eAdmissions website over 3 years ago you will need to register to apply online.
- If this is the first time you are using the eAdmissions website you must register to apply online
- You will need an email address to register.
- If you already have an email address you should set your spam/junk mail filter to 'Standard' so that emails from eAdmissions go straight to your inbox. You should check your spam/junk email folder now and then to make sure that messages from the eAdmissions website are not sent there by mistake.
- · Register yourself on the eAdmissions website.
- Your username will be displayed on screen, make a note of it.

- You will then be asked to create your own password.
- Login to the eAdmissions website using the username and password that you have just
- You will be sent a validation email containing your username and instructions on how to validate your email address.
- The email will also contain a link which will take you to the eAdmissions login page to start your application
- Please keep your username and password safe as you will need them to login and apply for any other children you have, and to see the outcome of your application. (It will be March for Secondary & 14/19 applications and April for Reception and Junior applications)
- You can opt to receive push notifications during the admissions process from an android phone or if you have an Apple device you can sign up to get notifications by downloading the 'ParentComms' mobile App.
- You can opt to receive text messages to your device during the admissions process, however you will not receive your outcome by text.
- It is important that you register well before the deadline in case there are any problems making your application. The closing dates are:
- 31 October for Secondary & 14/19 applications
- 15 January for Reception and Junior applications

Step 3: What to do if you have applied before using eAdmissions or you have just registered and received your username

- On the home page select 'Returning visitors' and enter your username and password.
- If you have forgotten your username we can resend it to you, just select the 'Forgotten your user name or password?' link.
- If you have forgotten your password we can reset it and send it to you, just select the 'Forgotten your user name or password?' link.

Step 4: Adding your child's details

The next page is your home page called 'Your home page'. This button will only be available for children whose date of birth falls within a relevant age range. Check your child's details are correct and select the 'Save and continue' button.

What to do if:

- This is the first time you are applying online using eAdmissions; or

- If you have used your eAdmissions account within the last three years to apply for a school place for any of your children you do not need to register again. Please go to Step 3.
- If this is the first time you are applying for a school place on the eAdmissions website, you must register to apply online. Additionally, if you have not used your eAdmissions account within the last three years, you must register again as your account will have been deleted. The person registering must have parental responsibility for the child and they must both live at the same address that has been stated on the online application.

The SIAS team provides parents and young people access to confidential and impartial information, advice and support so that they can make informed decisions related to education and pathways to employment. This is achieved by working in partnership with parents and young people, providing information, guidance and training, working with relevant agencies and ensuring parents' and young people's views influence local policy and practice.

What you can expect from the team:

- A response to enquiries by phone, email or letter within five working days

- Regular sessions held during term time where parents can make an appointment or drop in to meet them to discuss education, health or social care issues

When applying

- If your child has a sibling (brother or sister), at one of your preferential schools, please ensure that you tick the sibling box.
- Once you have completed your online application use the 'Submit Application' button to submit your application.
- You should receive an email with your 16 digit application reference number starting with 210 similar to this: 210-2024-09-E- 123456.
- If you do not receive a unique reference number it means your application has not been received and you will need to resubmit your application.
- Keep a record of your unique user name, password and application number which you will use for your application. It is important to keep this information safe so that you can log in and look at your application and review the results

Late applications

If you are making a late application between 1st November 2024 and 19th August 2025, you must complete and submit an online application at www.eadmissions.org.uk

All late applications received after 31st October 2024 (except those regarded as exceptional circumstance) will not be considered for a school place until after the initial offer of places on 3rd March 2025.

Late applications after August 24

If you are making a late application after 19th August 2025, you must apply for an in year place for your child, as the online application system will no longer be available.
