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Hello! Autism Support team here wishing you a very happy holidays!

The end of term can be both exciting and daunting for autistic young people, the excitement and anticipation of seeing family and friends and a 2 week holiday followed by the big clunky gatherings and social expectations.

It's important to keep an element of structure when out of school. Bedtimes and wakes up are a good place to start. If you are finding that your child is sleeping in later and later and going to bed later and later a great way to break this cycle is to wake your child up on time, using light and breakfast. This restarts your usual routine again.

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Top tips for supporting your child through a social event

- **Soft Entry:** If possible, come to the party at the start before the space is full of people.
- **Safe Space:** Identify a quiet safe space for your child to go to if they become overwhelmed.
- **Grounder:** Bringing a favoured object or activity for your child to centre onto will support their ability to regulate through familiarity.
- **Exit:** Give your child a code word which helps them say its time to go without having to say its time to go
- **Structure:** Create elements of certainty, first we will do X then we will do Y then its time to go home

Scooter and Cycle Safety and Parking

If you are Scootering or cycling to school, please remember to wear your helmets! We have seen a number of children who are not wearing helmets as they are riding their bikes or scooters to school. It is essential that you wear one to protect your head from injury incase you accidentally fall off.

Eyes: Put the helmet on your head. Look up. You should see the bottom rim of the helmet.

2



Ears: Make sure the straps form a 'V' under your ears when buckled. The straps should be a little tight but comfortable.

3



Mouth: Open your mouth as wide as you can. Does the helmet hug your head? If not, tighten the straps.

Please also be advised that parking or idling is not permitted in Karen Court Carpark, neighboring residential parking spots or on the zig zags directly outside of school. There is free parking available in the surrounding areas.
