

Nursery Summer 1

Communication and Language

Rhymes that: involve games and movement
Listen to clues and follow two part questions/instructions
Show an understanding of a treasure map and how to follow it
Introduce Story Maker
Explain 'odd one out' scenes
Listening games for identifying animal sounds
Use language related positions
Start conversations with adults/friends and continue it taking turns
Develop their communication and pronunciation
Read Write Inc Phonics
Continue with children's next steps following RWI sound order

Personal, Social Emotional Development

Increasingly following rules and understanding why they are important
Remembering some rules without needing an adult
Talk about feelings e.g happy or sad
Look at how we are growing and changing; What can I do now that I couldn't do before?
Playing co-operatively in a group. Children work on projects in groups lead by their own interests.
Keeping healthy-food and exercise

Physical Development

Kicking and Batting
Develop co-ordination and eye tracking to kick small and large balls and use a begin to use a bat.
Wheeled toys
Bikes, scooters and other wheeled toys.

Manipulate playdough to make snakes, and small balls
Begin to hold mark making tools with tripod grip
Begin to write name or some letters in your name
Begin to form some letters learnt in phonics

Expressive Art and Design

Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment e.g pirates going to steal the treasure

Sing the melodic shape (moving melody e.g up and down) of familiar songs

Sing the pitch of a tone sung by another person (pitch match)

Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings

Talk about keeping safe and link to road safety (PSED)

Pirates-use simple maps and symbols

Talk about past pirates

Literacy

Children create their own stories with 'story maker'
Sequence stories; beginning, middle and end
Begin to make and create our own story books
Story sacks for 'Ten Little Pirates,' & 'Pirates Love Underpants'

Ten Little Pirates-Mike Brownlow, Pirates love Underpants-Claire Freedman, Pirate Pete-Nick Sharatt

Maths

Recognise and order numbers to 10
To match a numeral to a quantity (to 5 and beyond)
Compares and sort groups of objects,
Represent quantities using fingers, marks, objects
Exploring 1 more and 1 less
Talk about dots
Lead on own repeats
Start to puzzle
Making patterns together
